How SIG activities fit with aims and ethos of EECERA

The SIG has developed partnership with Good Chance Charity to pursue a collaborative research project.

Ethical guidance to Good Chance teams has provided deeper understandings and better outcomes for refugee children and families in a forthcoming charity event.

Publication, Early Years Pack and research will expand further understandings of sense of belonging for children from refugee or migrant backgrounds in Early Childhood and Education settings and empower cultural pedagogy.

Furthermore, enhance and empower culturally relevant pedagogy through the development and dissemination of the Early Years Pack, and research analysis.

Continued consultation and guidance with Good Chance charity teams is providing ethical advice to reduce negative impact on children from refugee or migrant backgrounds.

Networking, future plans and links to other institutions

• Continue partnership with Good Chance in relation to research project, and continue consultation with Manchester University regarding funding and research collaboration.

• Networking with early childhood and education services, communities and institutions in Greece, UK, Poland, Australia to analyse the early years pack.

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
