The online panel discussion was part of the Symposium Living Multilingualism in Education. Five experts in the field were invited who shed light on this topic from different perspectives and contexts: Dr. Simone Mortini (Luxembourg), Dr. Anja Pesch (Norway), Dr. Gunhild Tomter Alstad (Norway), Professor Dr. Michel Vandenbroeck (Belgium) & Professor Dr. Claudine Kirsch (Luxembourg).

Each researcher gave a brief introduction to the topic before the panel discussion started, and we then launched into an online discussion with the participants.

SIG members and other interested researchers, teacher educators, and practitioners were invited to join the panel discussion.

This event was appreciated, and a conference is planned from the 12th to the 14th of May, 2025, at Luxembourg University. See below for the planned activities.
